

OUR FOURTH CONSECUTIVE MAGNET® DESIGNATION

We are proud to share that in 2021, Providence Holy Cross Medical Center obtained our fourth American Nurses Credentialing Center (ANCC) Magnet® designation under the nursing leadership of Jodi Hein, DNP, MHA, RN, NEA-BC, chief nursing officer. Only 579 hospitals both in the United States and internationally have achieved Magnet® status. Providence Holy Cross has the additional distinction of being included in the top 2.2% of hospitals worldwide that have received four consecutive Magnet® designations.

The Magnet® Recognition Program designates organizations worldwide where nursing leaders successfully align their nursing strategic goals to improve the organization's patient outcomes. To receive this designation, the medical center

must not only show evidence of excellent outcomes, but it must include nurses at every level in the initiatives that lead to those positive outcomes. Impressively, in 2021, Providence Holy Cross caregivers were recognized for the most clinical excellence awards in our history during a pandemic.

Providence Holy Cross Medical Center Chief Executive, Bernie Klein, M.D., noted that our connected, compassionate culture has led us to this prestigious honor. To nurses, Magnet® Recognition means education and development through every career stage, which leads to greater autonomy at the bedside. To patients, it means the highest quality care, delivered by nurses who are supported in continuously advancing their skills.

SUB-ACUTE CARE UNIT

At Providence Holy Cross Medical Center, we strive to provide compassionate, leading-edge care to all those we serve in the San Fernando and Santa Clarita Valleys. The Sub-Acute Care Unit here at our medical center has continuously provided restorative and long-term care to patients in our community, earning Five-Stars from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services, ranking it among the top 10% of nursing homes in the United States.

Thanks to the generosity of our donors, the unit has been able to continue to support our patients when it was most needed throughout the pandemic. With the health and safety of our patients always at the forefront, our caregivers focused on providing quality care during a difficult time. Additionally, we were able to provide new advancements to our unit by purchasing four TotalLift transfer chairs to comfortably transport our Sub-Acute patients.

With philanthropic support, our Sub-Acute Care Unit at Providence Holy Cross has continued to provide a vital role in the health and wellness of our community.

LITTLE MIRACLES INITIATIVE

Providence Holy Cross launched its Little Miracles Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU) Expansion Initiative in 2017.

The expansion will increase our NICU from 12 to 18 licensed beds, includes state-of-the-art technology and expands square footage to provide the highest quality care to the most vulnerable population. As the only Level III NICU in the North San Fernando Valley, our NICU serves as a tremendous resource to families, providing continuously available neonatologists, neonatal nurses and respiratory therapists.

Our service area has a projected population growth of 14%. To meet this demand, the expansion represents a 50% increase in the unit's capacity. With the six new beds, we anticipate keeping more of the Providence Holy Cross babies born on-site that would previously have been transferred. One of the most advanced tools our new NICU will include is Therapeutic Hypothermia Treatment. This equipment uses a noninvasive process to regulate the baby's body temperature. This process also ensures vital organs like the



brain, heart and liver continue functioning by maintaining a healthy body temperature.

The expanded NICU will have 18 Giraffe OmniBeds, a state-of-the-art technology that provides a combination of incubator, radiant warmer and protective bed all in one. Your support is making many features possible in the new NICU, such as web cameras, upgraded cardiac monitoring, a dedicated treatment room and a new family conference room where families can have private conversations with the care team.

After safely moving newborns to their temporary home in the intensive care unit while we build out the new space, we are making great progress on construction. We anticipate the fully expanded NICU will be open for care in the first quarter of 2023. Thank you to our philanthropic partners and donors for joining us on this important journey.

We thank you for your continued support as we work toward realizing our **\$7.3M goal**.
